These cards were collected by Francis Douce and form part of his collection (which is held by the Bodleian and the Ashmolean). However, there are also additions, e.g. packs transferred from the main Bodleian holdings, notably the shelfmark at 384729 g .18 . This is indicated, where known. If the Douce stamp has not been used, it is unclear whether the pack is original to the Douce collection or a later addition. The boxes contain printed slips and, sometimes, index cards.
