INTRODUCTION

In 1813 the Prince Regent endowed a Readership in Mineralogy, followed in 1818 by a Readership in Geology. In 1855 the University took over financial responsibility for both these posts, and with the opening of the University Museum in 1860 they were made into Professorships, entitled to rooms in the Museum. Both Departments were dependent for funding on student fees and a grant from the University, although from the mid nineteenth century student numbers were often low. On the resignation of HL Bowman as Waynflete Professor of Mineralogy and Crystallography in 1941, the chair was abolished. It was replaced by two readerships, one in mineralogy in the Department of Geology, the other in crystallography in the Department of Inorganic Chemistry. Mineralogy became a subdepartment of Geology, where the Reader in Mineralogy had a measure of independence but was subject to the overall direction of the Professor of Geology. In 1948 the Department moved into its new building in Parks Road, which comprised part of the old Clarendon Laboratory. The building was extended in 1963 and again in 1977. In 1984 the Department of Geology and Mineralogy merged with the Department of Surveying and Geodesy to become the Department of Earth Sciences, remaining situated in Parks Road. With the merger of the Departments, the Readership in Mineralogy came to an end, and was replaced by a University Lectureship in Mineralogy.

The records listed here were transferred to the University Archives in 1972. They relate to the former Departments of Geology and of Mineralogy and chiefly comprise student records, accounts and various papers relating to Departmental business.
