## The Royal Printing Archive (RPA)

An archive of the printing for the royal household by Harrison and Sons, purchased by the Bodleian through Bodley's American Friends.

These two tables provide a concordance to the box numbers housing the material and a conspectus by date. They are followed by a detailed description of the items, transcribed from the list supplied by the bookseller.

Those about which I am worried at present are the Bath and Imperial Order lists')

Correspondence relating to the Royal Commonwealth Tour of 1953–54 (especially to a list of passengers on the S.S. Gothic that Harrison's is to print)

#### D

Three clothbound 8vo notebooks containing (tipped in) correspondence between Harrison and Son and the various branches of the Royal Household.

One contains approximately a dozen letters and proofs, dating from 1938 to 1955, regarding seals being used by the Queen on royal warrants.

The second covers details of printing done for the Royal Tour of 1953–4 (approximately 20 letters)

The third contains 13 letters which document the various changes in royal stationery necessitated by the death of George VI and the accession of Queen Elizabeth

#### $\mathbf{E}$

A packet of 36 tickets to the coronation of King Edward VII and Queen Alexandra in 1902. Each ticket is different, and represents either a certain category of attendant at the coronation (such as 'Press' or 'Band'), or a different section of Westminster Abbey (Nave South, Triforium, North Transept, Choir Stalls, etc.)

#### $\mathbf{F}$

A folio, buckram-bound volume containing approximately 115 samples of printing done by Harrison's in connection with the funeral of King George V, on January 20, 1936, and with the coronation of George VI in May, 1937. Included are tickets, invitations, windshield stickers, seating charts, menus, programmes, and such lists as 'Allotment of Cars to Foreign Representatives' and 'Car Processions to Westminster Abbey on the 12th May, 1937'. Tipped in at the front is a carbon typescript (4 pp., folio with a few corrections in the hand of J.C. Phillips, who has signed his name at the end) sent by Harrison's to H.M.

Stationery Office, giving an account of the overtime work that had to be done in order to finish the printing connected with the funeral of George V.
